The Welcome Home Initiative:

First Congregational Church of St. Albans is a founding member of the Welcome Home Initiative (WH). WH provides people transitioning from homelessness to permanent housing in Franklin and Grand Isle Counties of Vermont with new- home essentials (mop, broom, dishes, cleaners, trash can, pots & pans, etc.), personal items (shampoo, deodorant, etc.), and a full pantry, fridge, and freezer stock of food.

The Welcome Home Initiative is a collaboration among: Franklin/Grand Isle CVOEO- Community

Action

First Congregational Church of St Albans Grace Episcopal Church, Sheldon Sheldon Methodist Food Shelf Holy Trinity Episcopal Church, Swanton As well as other churches and businesses

that have donated to the Initiative.

WH works with local housing case workers from:

F/GI Community Action Voices Against Violence Samaritan House Restorative Justice Center Pathways

First Congregational Church functions as the fiscal agent, collection center and pick-up hub for the program. WH serves on average 6-7 individuals/families to be housed a month.

We gather as neighbors who have experienced difficulties of every kind. We feel uncertain, fearful, and overwhelmed, and we wonder, "Is it fair?" No! Our difficulties are not fair, and God's grace meets our uncertainty with mercy and love.

We gather as a community that knows the suffering of our neighbors. We look at the effects of poverty, food insecurity, and trauma in our neighborhoods, and we wonder, "Is it fair?" No! The suffering of our neighbors is not fair, and God's grace calls us to respond to suffering with mercy and justice.

We gather as people who question how to live into God's abundance and flourishing in a world built on scarcity and greed, and we wonder, "Is it fair?" Yes! God's life of abundance and flourishing is fair, because it is merciful. May God's grace form us into people of mercy, justice, compassion, and truth-telling as we gather today. Amen.
