Walking the Walk Nugget: This Lent FCC member, psychologist, and communication expert, Doug Klette will be giving us communication "Nuggets"—practical steps to help us better love our neighbor.

Conversations:

In our effort to help the people we love, feel better and more at peace we often talk with them. That is a great start and is the essence of Unconditional Love.

Unfortunately, during this process, we often use two approaches, with the best of intentions, so we can make them feel better: #1 "Oh, I know just what you mean; that happened to me too. [Turning the focus away from them to yourself.] or #2 "How long has this been going on?" "What time did this happen?" "Didn't you know you couldn't trust her?" [Asking Questions.]

These common ROADBLOCKS TO COMMUNICATION can leave the person we are speaking with feeling abandoned or confused and frustrated. So, what can we do? Several concrete specific steps can be applied to help the speaker feel cared-about, understood, and respected,

- ATTEND. Give them your total attention. Face them with your body. Look into their eyes but do not try to stare them down. (If you let your eyes wander it is highly likely they will assume you do not really care.) Put your cellphone away.
- Keep your mind clear of your own thoughts and judgments.
 Be open and ready to hear whatever they say, even if you do not like it.
- 3. STRIVE to understand their words and feelings.
- 4. DISCIPLINE yourself from sending one of the ROADBLOCKS.
- TAKE A RISK and "SUMMARIZE" THE MESSAGE YOU HEAR FROM THEM.
