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Walking the Walk Nugget: This Lent FCC member, psychologist, and communication expert, Doug Klette will be giving us communication "Nuggets"—practical steps to help us better love our neighbor.

AVOIDING POWER STRUGGLES

Most Christians buy into notion of God's unconditional love. Sill, we are often at a loss of how to conduct God's word, especially when confronted with challenging situations.

Much interpersonal tension exists in both the public and private sectors: red vs blue politics, relationship tension between partners, tension between workers and management, and child rearing are only a few examples. There is no shortage of disagreement that manifests itself in open arguments or sullen resentment.

Psychologists call this condition, getting caught in a **POWER STRUGGLE**, where frustration and anger multiply in such a way that no one wins. It does not have to be this way. There is much one can do to in an effort to prevent getting caught up in the fight.

Believe it or not, a power struggle is a perfect example of cooperation. It takes two people (or groups) willing to do battle (physical or emotional). You can never control what the other person brings to you, but God gives us the **FREE WILL** to decide how we will choose to respond!

So, what are a few action steps that can be helpful:

- Learn to see the Power Struggle coming. Just because you are being invited into a conflict does not mean you must accept the INVITATION.
- Recognize that anger is a SECONDARY EMOTION, which often covers up SADNESS and FEAR. (Though they are yelling at you, often you aren't the problem at all!)
- PEOPLE IN PAIN are hungry to be understood. Avoiding the ROADBLOCKS and applying REFLECTIVE LISTENING can be quite powerful in promoting respectful dialogue instead of hate filled argument. Once an angry person feels understood and respected miracles can happen!

In truth, **DEFUSING** a power struggle is difficult work (the kind of work we practice done in Walk the Walk). Still, no matter how hard it gets, remember, you are offering God's Unconditional Love.
