Walking the Walk Nugget: This Lent FCC member, psychologist, and communication expert, Doug Klette will be giving us communication "Nuggets"—practical steps to help us better love our neighbor.

As Christians we study the scriptures and strive to apply their direction to our daily lives. God's offering of Unconditional Love, God's direction to "Love our neighbor," even to "Love our enemies," are examples.

Most Christians buy into these concepts, yet we are often at a loss as to how to conduct God's word. Two years ago, First Congregational began a series of training/discussion groups, for the purpose of learning specific, practical, skills that help us to live in the spirit of God's messages.

For those who participated, these "Nuggets" are designed to refresh your awarenesses of some of the skills discussed. For those who might be curious, or even interested in attending future presentations, this will give you a better idea of the Walk the Walk effort.

Conversations:

In our effort to help the people we love, feel better and more at peace we often talk with them. That is a great start and is the essence of Unconditional Love.

Unfortunately, during this process, we often use two approaches, with the best of intentions, so we can make them feel better: #1 "Oh, I know just what you mean; that happened to me too. [Turning the focus away from them to yourself.] or #2 "How long has this been going on?" "What time did this happen?" "Didn't you know you couldn't trust her?" [Asking Questions.]

These common **ROADBLOCKS TO COMMUNICATION** can leave the person we are speaking with feeling abandoned or confused and frustrated. So, what can we do?

Listen: give your full attention. Ask yourself, "What are they talking about?" "How are they feeling?" (NOT you and not how you think they should feel.)

This Week: Pay attention to the roadblocks you send.

Next time: Practical Steps for Deep Listening.

And if God meets us in all those places, then surely God meets us everywhere— at the water's edge, at the start of something new, after the baptism, and before the call. We are not alone.

God is all around. Let us worship the God of everything.
