Walking the Walk Nugget: This Lent FCC member, Doug Klette will be giving us communication "Nuggets"—practical steps to help us better love our neighbor.

THE RISKS AND REWARDS OF ASSERTIVENESS

As mentioned in last week's "Nugget," situations that require us to assert our concerns call on both our emotional maturity (remaining calm and respectful) as well as our intelligent application of the assertiveness formula steps.

People frequently wrestle with whether to risk sharing their concerns or simply suffer in silence while holding on to resentment.

I recently heard a story of a lady who was filled with resentment and spend a great deal of her time in backbiting gossip and spreading rumors about those she disliked.

The lady became alarmed when one night she had a vision of a large hand pointing down at her. Filled with guilt she told her priest of her nastiness to so many and begged for forgiveness.

The priest replied, "Not so fast. First you must take your pillow, and a knife, to the roof of your building. Cut open the pillow and return to me to report."

She followed the instructions. The priest asked what had happened, and the lady replied, "Feathers! Feathers everywhere."

She was then instructed to go back and gather up all the feathers, to which she replied, "I can't. I can't bring them back. I don't know where they all went." And the priest replied, "And that my dear lady is GOSSIP!"

When we choose to criticize and spread verbal resentment it can do irreparable harm and pain to relationships, even to people you don't know.

That is why Respectful Assertiveness can truly be a gift of both courage and love.

THE COMMUNION

One: The invitation is simple: come and eat of the feast. Not a meal to nourish the body, but to feed the soul. We receive the bread and juice connected to the ages: to the saint of old who felt unworthy, to the seeker eager to know God, to the one who

wonders what it's all about, to the one who eats with unburdened faith. Woven into this time are the hopes and tears of generations. There is great joy here. No one is turned away, for God is the host! May the peace of the Lord be with you always.

All: And also with you.

One: Lift up your hearts.

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, for thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, forever. Amen.

One: Gathered with his friends, Jesus took bread, broke it and said, "This is my body, broken for you. Take and eat." And Jesus took the juice and said, "This is my blood, spilled out for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Distribution of the Bread and Cup: Please hold your cup until we serve all, so that all may drink together.

One: Let us pray.

All: Gracious God, we thank you for refreshing us at your table. May we who share Christ's bread live his risen life. May we who drink Christ's cup bring abundant life to others. May the Holy Spirit who lights the world also enlighten our lives. Strengthen in us the hope you set before us, so that we and all your children shall be free, and so that the whole earth may live to praise your name. Amen.
